Dear Mr. Kovich,

Since April 5, 2025, my office, along with Stanislaus County Supervisor Channee Condit, other elected officials, and state and local agencies, has been actively engaged with you in your capacity as President of the Western Hills Water District (WHWD) to collaboratively address the impending water termination notice issued by the Kern County Water Agency (KCWA) for the community of Diablo Grande.

I want to thank both you and Supervisor Condit for the consistent communication and constructive partnership in our efforts to deliver viable and practical solutions for the residents of Diablo Grande. Our joint efforts—combined with your tireless leadership on these complex and challenging issues—have been focused solely on serving the best interests of the community.

However, in the interest of community of Diablo Grande, we must work together to ensure all parties involved recognize that this is a time for meaningful action and not divisive politics. The politicization of this crisis threatens to undermine the goodwill and progress we have all strived to make and I implore everyone involved to remain focused on the goal. We must all remain focused on the seriousness of the situation, which will profoundly impact real people.

I believe the threat of KCWA terminating water services is real. The residents of Diablo Grande face the very real possibility of having their water shut off as soon as June 30, 2025. This would create a humanitarian crisis affecting more than 600 homes and over a thousand people. This crisis is not the fault of the residents, families and homes are at risk and we, as decision makers must understand that the residents of Diablo Grande are victims to circumstances beyond their control. They are desperate for a solution and it is our duty to work together to deliver them a humane and just solution to this crisis, this is not the time for politics. As you are aware, I sent a letter to the Department of Water Resources (DWR) dated June 5, 2025, requesting a meeting between WHWD and DWR to discuss both short- and long-term solutions for Diablo Grande. I believe such a meeting is both necessary and urgent.

From the outset, my office has prioritized maintaining short-term water service continuity and ensuring emergency services can deliver critical drinking water if negotiations fail. We remain committed to supporting efforts to achieve a long-term solution for the Diablo Grande community. Securing a temporary extension of services from KCWA is vital to provide the community and its elected leaders additional time to develop sustainable, long-term solutions.

I remain committed to working with you on behalf of the residents of Diablo Grande to deliver real solutions for the community.
